- ISA contributed 637 KE in 2014-2015 and ISA² allocated 400 KE for 2016
- ISA/ISA² funds aim at progressing the action to deliver results related to interoperability of legal information:
 - Unique identifiers: uniform rules governing identification, designation and access to national and European legislation
 - Metadata describing legislative resources
 - ELI ontology: properties of legislative texts, relationship with other concepts/legislation
 - Implementation guidelines
 - Pilot projects
 - Raising awareness

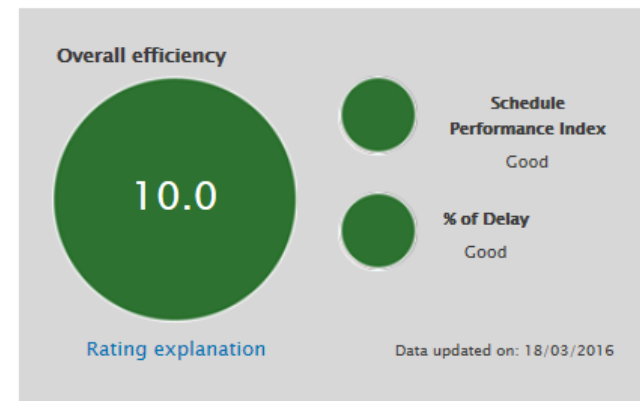

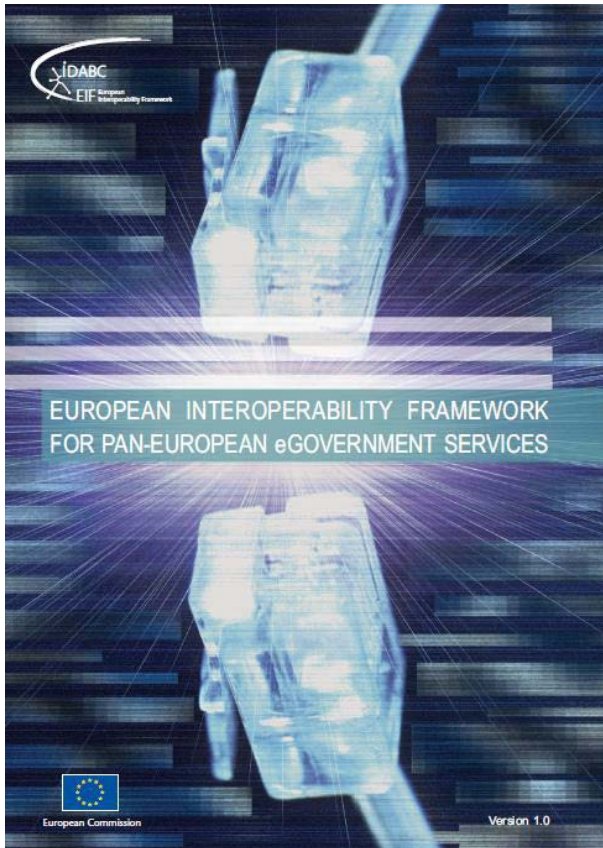
- Refine and extend the ELI ontology for all EU legislation: <http://publications.europa.eu/mdr/eli/index.html> (July 2014 - May 2015)
- Develop a pilot showing how ELI can be used to enable the exchange of information between systems (Sep - Dec 2014)
- Feasibility study on the use of ELI in EC NIM database and MSs to monitor transposition of EU legal acts (Sep - Dec 2014)
- Discovery phase to identify user needs and technical constraints to implement ELI (December 2014 and October 2015)
- ELI implementation methodology and guide based on findings of discovery phase (January - October 2015)
- Technical ELI implementation manual (March – October 2015)
- Engaging with groups and communities working in areas that are related to ELI (ongoing)
